

## School Improvement Plan | 2017-18

For the 2017-18 school year, our community at Pratt Community is dedicated to working together toward our school-wide goals, focused on increasing the academic achievement of all students and ensuring that our school is a great place for all learners.

### This year we are striving to achieve the following goals:

- Goal 1:** The percent of African American English at home students who demonstrate proficiency on the math portion of the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA) will increase from 37-53% by spring of 2018.
- Goal 2:** The percent of African American English at home students who demonstrate proficiency on the reading portion of the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA) will increase from 17% to 50% by spring of 2018. The percent of all proficient and non-proficient students showing medium to high growth will increase from 62% to 75% as measured by the reading portion of the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment(MCA). The percent of all non-proficient students showing medium to high growth will increase by 8% by spring of 2018.
- Goal 3:** The percent of behavior referrals generated by students in the cohort entering 5th grade will decrease from 45% of the schoolwide total to 15% by spring of 2018.

### In order to reach these goals, we'll be using the following strategies:

<b>Social Emotional Learning</b>	In addition to increasing the focus on social emotional learning for all students, there will be an intentional adult connection with students who have been identified as showing low growth and low proficiency
<b>Focus Time (MTSS)</b>	Targeted interventions and ongoing progress monitoring.
<b>Professional Learning Communities</b>	We will use our PLCs to use our real time data to make decisions and inclusive practices that will ensure success for all students, this includes considering all the student's gender, race, and/or ability level.
<b>Project Based Learning</b>	We will target growth in literacy achievement for all of our students by incorporating project based learning through every grade level (K-5).
